Our hearts will echo with our song


Daring to show them our way.

Academic Excellence is awarded when a student receives 1st place in three or more academic courses.

Special Awards

In July each year, students are invited to write an application to be considered for a Special Award at Speech Night. Preference for all Special Awards are reserved for students who have participated in the application process. In the unlikely event a suitable candidate cannot be chosen from the applicants, the Department Heads will nominate suitable candidates, which will then be voted upon.

Australian Defence Force Long Tan Leadership and Teamwork Awards

The Australian Defence Force (ADF) Long Tan Youth Leadership and Teamwork Awards commenced in 2006 to foster the development of youth in terms of behaviour and attributes considered essential in Australia's future leaders. The awards are a means to formally recognise those students who have demonstrated leadership and teamwork within their school and the broader community, and who display strong personal ethical values, such as doing one's best, respecting others and 'mateship' – aspects considered essential to the ADF and Australian society.

Australian Defence Force Future Innovators' Awards

This award recognises recipients' scientific and mathematical abilities while highlighting the value the Navy, Army and Air Force place on STEM skills and STEM career opportunities within Defence.

The Parliamentary Awards

These awards are provided to us from the Office of Sally Sitou, MP for Reid. They recognise students in several categories such as: Friendship, The Arts, Distinguished Academic Achievement, Sport, and commitment to Community.

The Ampol All-Rounder – Year 12

Every year, the Ampol All-Rounder Award provides the opportunity for the College to acknowledge a Year 12 student who has made an exceptional contribution both in and out of the classroom.

The award recognises qualities that include: Leadership, Service and Community, Sport, Arts and Culture, Attitude and Personal Conduct.

The Reuben F Scarf Award for Commitment – Year 12

The Reuben F Scarf Award for Commitment is offered to every school in New South Wales and held a special significance for Mr. Scarf, as he believed that 'young people who are persistent and dedicated, are the ones who ultimately reach their goals. A little recognition and help can be the magic that builds the confidence necessary to start them on their way upwards'.
